Meeting Minutes

Ken D. gave a report on the status of the upcoming March 13th-14th Front Range Coin Show. As of 2/13, a total of 46 of 57 dealer tables had already been reserved, which was actually a bit ahead of the usual booking rate. This also showed that the conflicting Fort Collins coin show held on that same weekend, had not seriously impacted dealer attendance.

Ken also reported that the Boulder County Fairgrounds had installed a new wi-fi system that should improve reception.

On an unrelated topic, Ken also noted that the coin club web page was in serious need of improvement or replacement. Monthly meeting locations and contact information are seriously out of date. Further discussion led to suggestions that the club identify someone skilled in web page design that could be contracted to do this job, if the costs were not excessive. This will be investigated.

As promised, Dave J. gave an excellent presentation on the banking and political events which led up to the formation of the New Orleans mint, from just after the revolutionary war to the year 1838. This

presentation was just one module of the class that Dave will be leading at ANA in Colorado Springs this coming summer.

This presentation was very well received, and had lively participation and discussion from the members as Dave went through his slides. He covered the formation of the First Bank of the United States under the first Treasury Secretary (and head/owner? of the bank), who was Alexander Hamilton. Dave also described the funding and financing of the fledgling nation. There were some colossal interest rates paid to domestic and foreign investors who were willing to back the bank with silver or gold! Often, the First (and eventually the Second) Bank of America solved cash reserve problems just by printing more bank notes and scrip!

Dave touched on the political in-fighting that occurred between both Banks of the United States, and the president as well as Congress. This culminated in the loss of the charter for the Second Bank of the United States in 1836, following a power struggle between Andrew Jackson and Nicholas Biddle in Congress.

Dave finished his presentation by noting a strong parallel between the politics and banking policies of the latter 1830s and those we see today. It truly appears that the more things/times change, the more they

stay the same!

President's Corner

Dave contacted the Berthoud Community Center this past month. He was told that the remodeling will be finished in April, which was good news. In the interim, Bob L. will touch base with PML Real Estate to see if the January/February temporary meeting location can also be use for the March and April monthly coin club meetings.

The potential bad news was that there will be a new fee structure for non-profits using the remodeled building, which may be considerably higher than was previously charged in the past. If the fees are too high, it may no longer be financially feasible for the club to have its monthly meetings there. Dave planned to contact the building coordinator to obtain the new meeting room costs.
